Every Wednesday	Every Friday	Plastics	<p>Plastic containers and packaging with the plastic mark </p> <p>Bottles, tubes, packs </p> <p>Cups, trays, wraps, labels, caps </p>	Put in a colorless or white translucent bag and leave at the designated location by 7 a.m. Dispose of items with the plastic mark, and wash dirty items before disposal.
1st and 3rd Friday of every month	1st and 3rd Wednesday of every month	Plastic bottles	<p>Bottles with the PET bottle mark </p> <p>Food and drink bottles, condiment bottles </p>	Wash, crush and discharge.
1st Saturday of every month	1st Saturday of every month	Cans	<p>Items with aluminum or steel marks </p> <p>Food and drink cans </p>	Wash and drain.
2nd Saturday of every month	2nd Saturday of every month	Bottles	<p>Food and drink bottles </p>	Wash and drain.
4th Saturday of every month	4th Saturday of every month	Metal objects and spray cans	<p>Metals without aluminum or steel marks, spray cans, gas cartridges, metal cooking utensils, aluminum foil </p>	<p>Wrap knives in paper or cloth and place them in a bag. Mark as "Dangerous" before discarding. </p> <p>Spray cans should be discarded after using up the contents and separating the metal parts from the bag without making any holes in them. </p>
2nd Tuesday of every month	2nd Tuesday of every month	Used clothing and fabrics	<p>Clothes that can be stored in a dresser or closet </p>	Wash dirty items before disposal, and dry out wet items before disposal.
2nd and 4th Friday of every month	2nd and 4th Wednesday of every month	Cuttings	<p>Home garden trees, hedges, and lawns that you have trimmed yourself, flower arrangements and potted plants, dead leaves and fallen leaves collected from your garden, and weeds that you have pulled </p>	<p>Cut branches and trunks to within 10cm in diameter and 1m in length and tie them with string before disposing of them. </p> <p>Shake off the dirt from weeds, dead leaves and fallen leaves, and place in a bag before disposing of them. </p>
3rd Saturday of every month	4th Saturday of every month	Hazardous waste	<p>Fluorescent lamps, mercury thermometers, button batteries, dry cell batteries </p>	<p>If fluorescent lamps break, they can release mercury-containing powder, which can be very dangerous, so please handle them with care. To prevent them from breaking, place old fluorescent lamps in the same paper box that new ones were used in before discarding them. If a fluorescent lamp breaks, wrap it in paper or cloth and put it in a bag marked as "危険 (Dangerous)". Button batteries are also collected at the store where they were purchased or sold.</p>
4th Tuesday of every month	4th Tuesday of every month	Landfill waste	<p>Broken items, mirrors, ceramics, glass cups, lighting fixtures, hard plastic products, small amounts of tiles, bricks, blocks, lighters, T-shaped razors (plastic), small electrical appliances, cords </p>	<p>Wrap broken bottles or glass in paper or cloth and put in a bag marked as "危険 (Dangerous)" before discarding. Remove button batteries and dispose of them as hazardous waste. Always use up the contents of lighters or release the gas. Four types of home appliances (televisions, air conditioners, washing machines/dryers, refrigerators) and computers are prohibited from disposal. </p>
1st and 3rd Tuesday of every month	1st and 3rd Tuesday of every month	Paper	<p>Newspapers, magazines, advertising flyers </p> <p>Cardboard, unprocessed, with a corrugated cross section </p> <p>Paper cartons, milk or juice cartons with white interiors, anything less than 500ml is burnable </p> <p>Magazines Paper items not included in the categories on the left Books, magazines, envelopes empty boxes, paper bags, small pieces of paper </p>	<p>Tie crosswise with string according to the classification on the left and leave in the designated location by 7 a.m. Put small scraps of paper in an envelope and put them out with magazines. Tissues, gold- and silver-plated paper, photographs, paper cups, receipts, etc. should be put out with burnable waste. </p>

After the application period ends, a Bulky Waste Collection Notification Postcard (with bulky waste sticker attached) will be delivered to your home approximately two weeks later. Please affix the sticker with your name on it and dispose of your garbage by 7 a.m. on the collection day indicated on the postcard. A collection company will come to collect the garbage on the collection day.
